Authority Member Rigdon moved approval of the following resolution:

A RESOLUTION HONORING ALICIA SEYMOUR OF THE COLORADO SPRINGS POLICE DEPARTMENT, AS TELECOMMUNICATOR OF THE FOURTH QUARTER 2015.

WHEREAS, the El Paso – Teller County Emergency Telephone Service Authority was created to provide a two-county-wide E9-1-1 system; and

WHEREAS, the members of the Authority wish to recognize outstanding call takers and dispatchers within the system through the Telecommunicator of the Quarter and Telecommunicator of the Year programs; and

WHEREAS, On September 29th Alicia answered a 911 call like she has done thousands of times before and was presented with an unknown caller. There was a female voice on the other end of the line however all this woman was able to do was moan. Alicia immediately recognized the urgency and jumped in to ask the woman to press a button if she was able to speak to her; there was only dead air. She quickly used all of her resources to find an address for the cell phone, checked premise history for the address and noticed a history of suicide attempts. As the woman began to moan and make noises again, Alicia was quick to reassure her that she was sending help. She began to use the woman's name that she had found in the previous calls for service. She attempted to address the caller's safety and determine if the woman had tried to hurt herself. For over 15 minutes she continued to try and gather information and keep the woman calm.

WHEREAS, When police and fire finally made contact they discovered that the woman had survived a failed suicide attempt and had essentially shot her face off. Alicia did her job as she is expected to do but she did it with great compassion and empathy.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

The El Paso – Teller County Enhanced 9-1-1 Authority honors Alicia Seymour as the Telecommunicator of the Fourth Quarter of 2015.


