DIFFICULTY SPEAKING BETWEEN BREATHS

Can also be described as:

- Unable to **complete a full sentence** without taking a breath
- Only able to **speak a few words** without taking a breath
- Breathing attempts that

14. A **sudden, unexplained collapse** resulting in **unconsciousness**, even when reported as a **ground-level fall**, should be considered a

COMPLETE Obstruction (in ProQA only)

Total obstruction of the upper airway that prevents:

- Talking
- Breathing

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LONG FALL

The patient has fallen from a distance of:

- Adult/Child – **10–29ft (3–9m)**

NON-PRIORITY Complaints (ALPHA-level)

1. **No** priority symptoms (complaint conditions 2–12 **not** identified)
2. Blood pressure abnormality (asymptomatic)
3. Dizziness/Vertigo
4. Fever/Chills
5. General weakness
6. Nausea
7. New onset of immobility
8. Other pain (non-OMEGA-level)
9. Transportation only
10. Unwell/ill
11. Vomiting

Symptoms of Shock (in ProQA only)

- Decreased consciousness
- Eventual collapse
- Pallor
- Shallow breathing
- Sweating
- Unconsciousness
- Weak/Rapid pulse

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CHANGING COLOR

Changing colors of **clinical significance** include:

- Ashen
- Blue
- Cyanotic
- Gray
- Mottled

First Law of Fainting

Near fainting is best described as "almost fainted" and should be considered the same as fainting (not

Heart Attack Symptoms

EMDs may initially receive non-specific complaints in heart attack cases. Due to patient denial or caller confusion, the following **symptoms may not be recognized as a heart attack**:

- Aching pain
- Chest pain/discomfort (now gone)
- Constricting band
- Crushing discomfort
- Heaviness
- Numbness
- Pressure

NOT BREATHING Situations

The following, when **offered** in response to "Tell me exactly what happened" or any listed Entry Question:

- **Not breathing** at all
- **UNCERTAIN BREATHING**
- Hanging
- Strangulation
- Suffocation
- **COMPLETE** obstruction
- Drowning arrest (out of water)
- Underwater (non-**SPECIALIZED** rescue)
