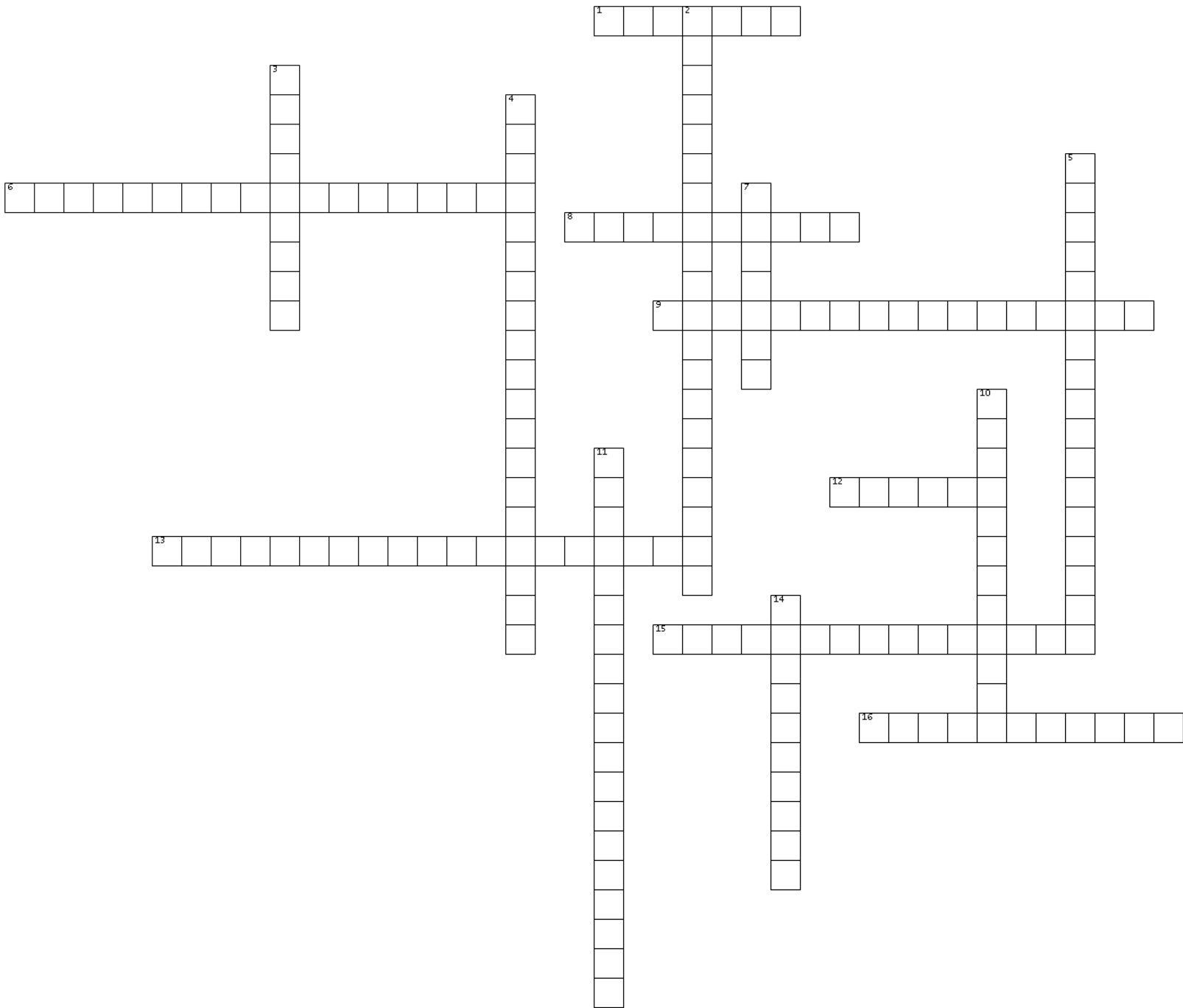

ACROSS

1. An illness or other biological malady
6. An abnormal firing of braincells usually resulting in period of unconsciousness and full-body jerking movements. Also known as convulsions, epilepsy, or fits.
8. Any body of water that is moving and has a visible current
9. Uncontrolled bleeding (spurting or pouring) from any area or anytime a caller reports "serious" bleeding
12. A physical injury or wound cause by an external force through accident or violence
13. Total obstruction of the upper airway that prevents talking/breathing/coughing
15. A seizure that is mentioned as different from or not normal as compared to the patient's previous seizures
16. The patient has fallen from a distance of 30ft/10m (3 stories) or higher

DOWN

2. An ineffective deteriorating breathing pattern that lingers after the heart has essentially stopped pumping blood to the brain
3. Six hours or more have passed since the incident or injury occurred (without priority symptoms)
4. Minor usually shallow (non-penetrating) wounds without priority symptoms (even in DANGEROUS or POSSIBLE DANGEROUS body areas)
5. A person underwater or stranded in a natural setting or a man-made structure not intended for domestic use (lake/river/sea/canal/water tank)
7. An attack that produces serious multiple wounds or injuries as opposed to a single or limited number of bites
10. Localized twitching of a part of the body (such as the hand/arm/leg/ or face) in a conscious patient
11. Complaint may include but are not limited to forceful coughs/wheezing sounds between coughs/abnormal breathing/difficulty speaking normally
14. A patient with a non-categorizable Chief Complaint who does not have an identifiable priority symptom
